Ask an adult to drill an odd number of holes around the edge of your wood disc. The holes should be slightly smaller than the diameter of the willow you are using.

Feed a single rod of willow up through each of the holes from underneath and pull as hard as you can until it is securely wedged. (If you would like a handle on your basket, bend one of the willow uprights all the way over and back down a hole on the opposite side and use an extra pieces of willow to wedge it securely in place). Use the secateaurs to trim off the ends underneath.

When you have finished building up the sides of your basket you can trim off the

protruding ends around the side of your basket and then the uprights.
